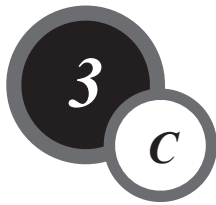

Maurice Richard

In Canada, more children play soccer than any other sport, but ice hockey is also popular. Many children dream of becoming professional ice hockey players. For them, ice hockey players are special. One famous Canadian ice hockey player is Maurice Richard.

Maurice was born in 1921 in Montreal, Canada. When he was growing up, he enjoyed ice-skating, baseball, and boxing, but he loved ice hockey the most. When he was 14, he started playing ice hockey at school with his friends. He left school and got a job with his father when he was 16. Then, when he was 18, he joined an amateur* ice hockey team.

When Maurice was 21, he started playing for a professional ice hockey team called the Montreal Canadiens. Maurice soon became an important player on his team, and he was the first player to get 50 goals in one season. He was strong and skated very fast, so people started calling him “The Rocket.” When he played, his team won many games. He helped the Montreal Canadiens to win the Stanley Cup* eight times. Maurice stopped playing ice hockey in 1960. He was a professional ice hockey player for 18 years.

When Maurice died in 2000, many Canadians were sad. People loved him because he was one of the greatest ice hockey players in history. He is still remembered because there is an award called the Maurice “Rocket” Richard Trophy. Every year, it is given to the player who gets the most goals in one season.

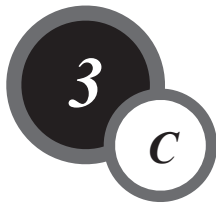

Grand Central Terminal

One of New York City's most famous symbols is Grand Central Terminal. This is the city's main train station. About 750,000 people walk through it every day.

When the station was first built in 1871 by a man named Cornelius Vanderbilt, it was called Grand Central Depot. In 1901, a larger building was built and named Grand Central Station. However, that building was closed because of a big train accident in 1902. In 1913, a new and even bigger station was opened, and it was given the name Grand Central Terminal. This is the one that people can still see today.

Grand Central Terminal has 44 platforms.* That is more than any other train station in the world. It also has 67 train tracks.* The main hall is called the Main Concourse, and it is very big. The windows are about 23 meters high. The Main Concourse has many interesting things to look at. In the middle, there is a famous clock made of opal. Opal is a very expensive stone, so it cost millions of dollars. Many people meet their friends by the clock.

On the ceiling* of the Main Concourse, there is a picture of the night sky with 2,500 bright stars. This ceiling was made in 1912, but it was covered in 1944 because it was old and rainwater was coming into the building. From 1996 to 1998, the ceiling was cleaned and fixed. Now, it is one of the most beautiful parts of the building.

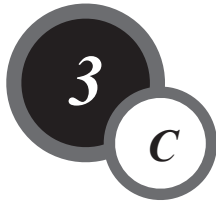

The Bluenose

Around the world, many people love to ride on boats in summer. There are many different kinds of boats. For example, sailboats use the power of the wind to move over the water, and they are very popular. One of the most famous sailboats in history was called the Bluenose.

The first Bluenose was built in 1921 in Nova Scotia, Canada. It was used for both fishing and racing. In October 1921, the Bluenose took part in a famous boat race and won first prize. From then, the Bluenose became well known. It also won the same race in 1922 and 1923. During the 1920s, it was the fastest sailboat in the North Atlantic Ocean, so people called it the “Queen of the North Atlantic.”

The Bluenose used the power of the wind, but it was not as fast as newer boats with engines.* People liked boats with engines because they were powerful and easy to use. These boats became very popular in the 1930s, so the captain and owner of the Bluenose sold it in 1942.

Sadly, after the Bluenose was sold, it hit a coral reef* in the ocean and sank. However, many Canadians still remembered it. They loved the story about the Bluenose, so a company decided to build a new Bluenose in 1963. It was given to the people of Nova Scotia in 1971, and people can still see and ride on it today. There is even a picture of the Bluenose on a Canadian coin. The Bluenose will never be forgotten.

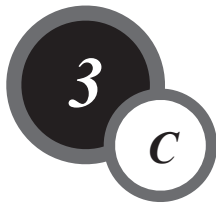

The Grand Canyon

In Arizona in the United States, there is a very large and deep valley,* and the Colorado River runs through it. This place is called the Grand Canyon, and it is 446 kilometers long, about 1.6 kilometers deep, and up to 29 kilometers wide. The weather there can be very hot in summer and very cold in winter.

Every year, millions of people come to see the beautiful views of the Grand Canyon. Ninety percent of the people visit an area called the South Rim because it is open all year round and it is easy to get there from some big cities. The North Rim is only open from May to October. Recently, people have started to visit the West Rim, too.

Native Americans* have lived in and around the canyon for thousands of years. In 1540, García López de Cárdenas from Spain became the first European to see the canyon. But Cárdenas was not able to climb down into the canyon. Much later, in 1869, an American named John Wesley Powell traveled down the Colorado River by boat with some men. During the trip, Powell named the place the “Grand Canyon” in his diary.

In 1903, U.S. president Theodore Roosevelt decided to protect the canyon and made it a national monument.* In 1919, it became a national park. Today, some people go hiking or camping in the canyon, and boat tours are also popular. Because the canyon is so big, a boat tour can take about two weeks. Many people enjoy this beautiful place every year.

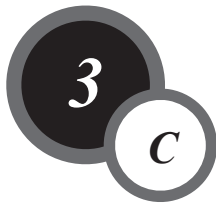

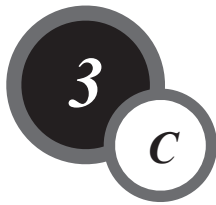

Tom Longboat

Tom Longboat was a member of the First Nations* and a famous long-distance* runner. He was born in Ontario, Canada, on June 4, 1887. He grew up in a poor family on a farm, and his father died when Tom was five. When he was a child, he didn't like school. At that time, Canadian schools didn't want the First Nations people to speak their own languages.

In 1901, Tom heard about Bill Davis, a member of the First Nations who won second place in the Boston Marathon. Because of Bill, Tom started to run, too. In 1905, Tom ran his first race, and only two years later he won the Boston Marathon. He finished almost five minutes faster than anyone else.

Tom won many races in his life, so he was a very successful runner. However, in 1916, he decided to stop entering races and help Canada in World War I.* Tom was a strong runner, so he carried important messages for the army. His job was to carry them quickly between army posts* in France.

After the war ended in 1918, Tom went back to Canada and stopped running. He lived and worked in Toronto until 1944, and then he moved back to his hometown. He died in January 1949 when he was 61 years old. Six years later, Canada decided that Tom Longboat should become a member of Canada's Sports Hall of Fame. This is a special group of famous Canadian people in sports. Today, Tom Longboat is still remembered as Canada's best long-distance runner.
